The Township of Hanover Police Department completed its goals as far as education, training, preparedness and community involvement are concerned. Below is a brief summary of our 2015 activities:

- In 2015 Patrolman Grawehr returned to Whippany Park as the School Resource Officer, he was replaced on the road by Patrolman Michael Byrnes, who joined the department in September
- The Department participated in *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over 2015*, statewide impaired driving crackdown, from August 21- September 7, 2014. The program resulted in 2 DWI arrest, and the following summonses were issued: 15 suspended licenses, 52 speeding, 6 cell phone/texting , 2 for lack of seat belt use, 3 reckless driving and 22 Careless driving. 235 other violation ticket were issued during the crackdown
- Lieutenant Mark Roddy, Sergeant Michael Look and Sergeant Ryan Williams, members of the Morris County Rapid Deployment Team continued various quarterly training activities.
- Lt. Roddy, Sgt. Look, Williams and Patrolmen Gundersdorf, Martino, Magley and Quinn attended regular tactical training with the Florham Park, Madison, East Hanover Police Departments
- Patrolman Zakrzewski attended training to join the motorcycle unit.
- The Department's bicycle unit, consisting of eight trained officer, participated in the following:
 - Hanover Township Fireworks display
 - Hanover Township Memorial Day Parade
 - Patrolman Pilipie attended Masquerade at Malapardis
 - In addition Sergeant Look and Patrolman Gundersdorf conducted a bicycle safety presentation for Hanover Recreation at Salem Drive School.
- MADD: Patrolman John Schauder was honored for "outstanding and distinguished service to your community for DWI Enforcement..." for the year 2014.
- The Department provided traffic safety and security during the township's fireworks and the summer concert series
- The Department assisted the Morristown Police with the St. Patrick's Day Parade
- Patrolman Pilipie participated in a car seat demonstration and installation event at Bayer Day.

- Patrolman Grawehr participated in the health fair at the Hanover Township Recreation Center and the "Touch a Truck" program at Bee Meadow Park.
- Lieutenant Roddy assisted Bayer and Arthur Gallagher with a workplace violence/emergency action planning
- Chief Gallagher and Lieutenant Roddy assisted 3M Corp with Emergency Action Planning
- Sergeant Williams, Patrolmen Pilipie and Prach instructed at the Morris County Police Academy
- The department conducted multiple events at various schools within the township.
 - Patrolman Grawehr visited Memorial Junior School for career day.
 - Patrolman Pilipie visited "My Special Spot" preschool to talk about safety.
 - Lieutenant Roddy assisted Whippany Park High School and Hanover Township schools with security and safety planning drills
